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Introduction, Learning Outcomes:

The course is designed for Architecture and Civil Engineering students with a lower-intermediate knowledge of English. The aim of the course is to improve students' career specific vocabulary and develop the four key language components: reading, listening, speaking and writing.

General Course Description and Main Content:

Skills are developed through realistic reading passages and dialogues, reading and listening comprehension tasks and guided speaking and writing exercises. Topics include parts of a building, construction materials, design and construction, design tools and materials, drawings and blueprints, history of architecture, sustainability.

Methodology:

The course will involve instructions from the teacher as well as frequent group collaboration. Students are expected to keep up to date with the homework set.

Attendance:

Attending is required all classes, and will impact the grade (max. 10%). Unexcused absences will adversely affect the grade, and in case of absence from more than 30% of the total number of lesson will be grounds for failing the class. To be in class at the beginning time and stay until the scheduled end of the lesson is required, tardiness of more than 20 minutes will be counted as an absence. In the case of an illness or family emergency, the student must present a valid excuse, such as a doctor's note.
