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General Course Description and Main Content:

The course is designed for students with pre-intermediate - intermediate knowledge of English. The aim of the course is to develop spoken (receptive, interactive and productive) language proficiency in the context of academic topics relevant to students in higher education, e.g. giving presentations, taking part in discussions, listening to lectures and taking notes. It includes strategies for undertaking research and dealing with unfamiliar academic vocabulary. The term-end grade will be awarded on the basis of the two grades obtained during the term (one grade will be awarded for the end-term test, and one grade for preparing and giving a presentation).

Methodology:

The course is based on individual and team work, taking part in discussions and completing home assignments.
