# AIMS AND OBJECTIVES

The course is designed for students with very little previous knowledge of the Hungarian language. The aim of the course is to enable students to manage basic communicational situations in the Hungarian language environment, especially those in a university and faculty context. By the end of the course students will be able to use basic vocabulary and structures to manage very simple conversations in Hungarian.

# CONTENT

Overview:

The main topics covered include food and meals, shopping, clothes, free time activities, holidays and daily routine. Students learn the basic vocabulary of the particular topics and the most commonly used expressions, terms and phrases for everyday conversation. They will also learn to express possessive relations, to use present and past verb conjugations, verbal prefixes and multiple suffixes.

### REQUIREMENTS AND ASSESSMENT

#### Attendance:

Attendance is required for all classes and will impact the grade. Unexcused absences will adversely affect the grade, and absences from more than 30% of the total number of lessons will be grounds for failing the class. Punctual attendance for the whole lesson is required and arriving more than 20 minutes late will be counted as an absence. In the case of an illness or family emergency, the student must present a valid excuse, such as a doctor's note.

### Minimum Course Requirements, Assessment and Grading Policy:

For passing the course students are required to pass the midterm test and the final test.

Students can retake a missed or failed test only once. They can also re-sit the tests if they want to improve their mark. In the latter case the result of the re-sit will be taken into consideration when the final course grade is calculated.

## Grading Scale:

85 – 100% 5 (Excellent) 76 – 84% 4 (Good) 61 – 75% 3 (Average) 50 – 60% 2 (Poor) 0 – 49% 1 (Fail)

Final course grade calculation: 35% midterm test, 35% final test, 30% attendance, participation and home assignments
