COURSE DESCRIPTION

This course is designed to prepare students for the IELTS language exam, which is widely required for professionals looking to work or study abroad. The course is intended for students who already have a good level of English and are aiming to achieve a score of 6.5 or higher. The course will focus on the core skills needed for the speaking and listening portions of the exam, specifically focusing on academic material rather than general English.

SYLLABUS

1. GOALS AND OBJECTIVES

Upon completing of the course students will have a detailed view of what is involved in the IELTS speaking and listening exam, what is needed to pass the exam and what their expected grade would be if they did the exam. Students will:

practice speaking and listening tasks.

complete tasks aimed at improving their vocabulary.

complete a self-assessment task which aims to give an approximate view of their language level

get tips and advice for how to prepare specifically for the language exam.

To take this course, students must have either a recognized intermediate level (B2) language exam or have successfully passed a placement test. Students with a lower level of English should contact Marcus for alternative course options.
